Attendance Prizes



Good attendance is important because:

- Your child needs to be in school to be able to learn and achieve.
- Lessons are taught in a sequence and it can be difficult to catch up if you miss a lesson.
- For children to have relationships with others and to form lasting friendships.
- For a child's confidence to attempt new work and to work alongside others

REMINDERS:

If your child is going to absent from school, please phone the school's attendance number, 0115 9649388, to speak to one of our attendance team. This phone is staffed from 8:30am -11:00am. If you are calling outside these times, or no-one is available, then please leave a voicemail message. A big thank you to all parents/carers who keep the school informed on a daily basis when their child is absent. This helps us tremendously in the safeguarding of all children who attend Ambrook.

In line with the 1996 Education Act, we expect all children on roll to attend school every day, when the school is in session, as long as they are fit and healthy enough to do so. Unsatisfactory explanations will result in unauthorised absence.

Examples of unsatisfactory explanations include:

- A pupils'/family member's birthday
- Not having uniform
- Closure of a sibling's school
- Illness where the child is considered well enough to attend school
- Illness of a family member
- Bus not running or car broken down

If your child has a doctor, hospital or dentist appointment during school time, please bring your child into school and collect at the time of the appointment or if the appointment is early morning, please bring your child back to school to reduce their lost learning time. We ask that you present the letter/appointment card in order for this absence to be authorised. All day absences will not be authorised.

If you do not report your child's absence, we will phone, text and write to you to ask where your child is. As part of our Safeguarding Policy we have to ensure all children who are not in school are safe, please help us to do this.

Punctuality

Arriving late is very unsettling for your child, and stops the teacher from working with other children. Please make sure they are here in plenty of time, remember our classrooms doors open at 8.40am but close promptly at 8.50am. If you arrive late, your child MUST be brought into school by an adult, a late slip needs to be completed and signed by the parent/carer.

Leave of Absence & Term- Time Holidays

From September 2013 the law changed and now states that parents do not have the right to take their child out of school for holidays in term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. We ask parents to recognise that pupil absence during term time can seriously affect a pupils learning. Parents are therefore strongly urged to avoid booking family holidays during term time.

Leave of absence which is taken for the following reasons will not be authorised and does not count as exceptional circumstance:

- Availability of cheaper holidays
- Overlap with beginning or end of term
- Holidays taken without following school procedure
- Attending a family wedding/birthday
- Availability of desired accommodation
- Booked the wrong dates by mistake or without checking
- Booked by another family member
- Availability of time off work

By law parents have to apply for permission in advance from the school. If your request is not covered by exceptional circumstances and you take your children out of school unauthorised we are required to inform the Local Authority who may then issue a Penalty Notice fine of £60, per child, per adult to be paid within 21 days, potentially rising to £120.
