

Suddenly he saw something!


He rowed closer and closer and closer until he could see... the penguin!

A rainbow is a colourful arc that we see in the sky. A rainbow is made of light.






A rainbow happens when it is sunny and rainy at the same time.

We can only see a full rainbow from above.


